■ KinderWorld's Recognition by Hanoi's People Committee



On 25 June 2017, Hanoi People's Committee hosted the conference titled "Hanoi 2017: Investment Cooperation and Development" with the attendance of Mr Nguyen Xuan Phuc - Prime Minister, Mr Hoang Trung Hai - Deputy Prime Minister and Party Secretary of Hanoi, Mr Nguyen Duc Chung - Chairman of Hanoi People's Committee and relevant Authorities.

On this significant event, the Memorandum of Understanding

(MOU) for investment in international educational projects between KinderWorld Education Group and Hanoi People's Committee was signed. The MOU not only strengthens investment cooperation between KinderWorld and Hanoi City, but also contributes to the improvement in general education, vocational, life skill and English competency training for officers, teachers and students around the city. The 2017 Asia Pacific Mathematical Olympiad for Primary Schools (APMOPS) ended successfully with the Invitation Round on Saturday 27th May 2017. APMOPS is a prestigious examination held annually by the Hwa Chong Institution of Singapore, for which KinderWorld has been the co-host since 2009.

The first round of APMOPS 2017 was successfully held on 8th April 2017 with the participation of more than 359 excellent students from all over Vietnam. This year, the seven best candidates of round one were honored to be invited to the second round by Hwa Chong Academy. The top five students were sponsored with return air-tickets by KinderWorld to attend the Invitation Round at Hwa Chong Institution in Singapore.



The Final Round of APMOPS 2017 in Singapore was successful with excellent results for Vietnam. Hoang Ngoc Bao Khue was ranked 4th among the Top 10 best students. KinderWorld is proud to contribute to this event enabling young mathematical geniuses to interact and compete with others of the same age from across the Asia-Pacific Region including Australia, India, Singapore, China, New Zealand and Vietnam.

B. PEGASUS

■ Collaboration with Autodesk, US

Autodesk Inc. provides more than 160 softwares in architecture, engineering, construction, media and entertainment.

In February 2017, Pegasus and Autodesk had a meeting with Dr. Ho Ky Minh – Vice Chairman of People’s Committee of Da Nang city to present our proposal contributing to Danang’s vision of becoming the 1st Smart City in Vietnam by 2025.

Pegasus is working on establishing a Pegasus Smart Uni-City located in Hoa Quy new urban area. The Da Nang City Leaders has given its strong support for this proposal but will have to work within the City’s Guidelines on land allocated for Education purposes.

Pegasus Smart Uni-City will feature a Media and Entertainment and ICT Training Academy, an ICT Incubator as well as a Center of Excellence incorporating collaborative co-working spaces. This will be a destination for enterprising and innovative individuals and start-up

enterprises to come together to create break-through products.

Pegasus has been closely working with Autodesk to promote our plan widely to Danang community. On 8 March, the Progressive Dialogue with Autodesk was successfully hosted by Pegasus with participation and active idea contribution of representatives from Danang Investment Promotion Agency (IPA), Department of Education & Training (DOET), Department of Construction, Department of Information and Communication (DIC). Pegasus also had discussions with Da Nang University’s team lead by Associate Professor Doan Quang Vinh – Vice President, on the possibility of offering Year 3 and 4 students in the relevant majors internship positions and also job opportunities when these students graduate.

In May 2017, Pegasus and Autodesk, US signed an MOU to formalize our collaboration on developing educational programme, curricula, projects and activities related to teaching/instruction in the use of Autodesk softwares.

For a start, both sides are looking at the possibility to introducing as part of Singapore International Schools STEM Curriculum to students studying in year 9 and 10 as an additional subject in SIS@Saigon South, SIS@Gamuda Gardens and SIS@Da Nang.

Upon receiving University License, Pegasus will be able to commence the teaching of ENU’s programme in Vietnam.

Besides talking to students at Singapore International School in Hanoi, Danang and Hochiminh City, Dr VanAken also had extensive meetings with the Group Management on how to accelerate the collaboration between two organisations in the fields of student recruitment, exchange of expertise and articulation pathway. Pegasus and Elmhurst Team have also worked closely and successfully organized a Immersion Programme experience of Singapore International School students in July.

■ **Close Collaboration between Pegasus & Industry Partner, Empire Group Holdings**

On the morning of 9 May 2017, Pegasus International College together with other four training institutions in Danang participated in the Memorandum of Understanding Signing Ceremony with Empire Group at its premise, Naman Retreat Danang.



The Ceremony marked the initial collaboration between industry enterprises and training institutions in Danang to help meet the demand for high quality human resources. The Empire Group is committed to a super project model for Cocobay, which requires around 10,000 employees when fully developed.

Since its establishment in Da Nang, Pegasus International College has pride itself on the close ties with the hospitality and hotel industry in Da Nang which is now voted as the most

livable city in Vietnam. Pegasus courses emphasize on three aspects which makes its students job ready: 60% practical sessions; 40% theory sessions and industry internships placements. Currently Pegasus is well-known as the leading provider of high quality human capital despite the fact that its students are only Diploma and Advanced Diploma students. Contrary to popular belief, a Diploma can lead to a Senior Managerial position in the hotel industry and money is better spent on such courses than on University Degrees that do not lead to employment.

Besides the MOU signing, scholarships were presented to the best academic students at colleges and universities. Two Pegasus students received a monetary scholarship – one in the Australian qualification Certificate IV in Hospitality and the other in the Certificate in Swiss Boutique Hotel Management course. These two courses are among a range of effective courses being delivered at Pegasus helping improving the labor force quality in Hospitality and Tourism in Central Coast in general and in Danang City in particular.

■ **VTOS-based Corporate Training by Pegasus Hanoi and Pegasus Danang**

From January to June 2017, Pegasus Hanoi has conducted many training programs based on Vietnam Tourism Occupational Standards (VTOS) to different hotels & cruises in Ha Noi and Ha Long.

Pegasus has been entrusted by Army Hotel, Fortuna Hotel, Melia Hotel, May de Ville in Ha Noi to help to upskill both their front line & middle-management staff in areas including Front Office & Housekeeping, Hotel supervision and Hotel management. Besides, we also sent trainers to Emperor Cruises, Ha Long to help establish standards of F& B service before their official launch in Ha Long.



Since July 2016, the customized Pegasus Star Chef Training programme has been helping Vin Pearl's Management to produce Chefs who are capable to produce its own in-house developed recipes to the same exacting standards regardless of the location of the Vin Pearl property i.e. from Phu Quoc to Nha Trang to Da Nang!

Pegasus also assisted VinPearl Group to recruit Chefs for this customized programme and to-date 120 Chefs has been trained under this customized programme developed by Pegasus and headed by its Head of Hospitality & Culinary Arts School, Ms Karen Goodwins, who is from Australia and is an acclaimed cookbook author.

Tourist arrivals in Vietnam have increased by 30 per cent compared to last and this year more than 13 million foreign visitors are expected to visit Vietnam. Many 4 and 5 star properties are sprouting up but these bricks and mortars alone cannot sustain and create repeat visits to hotel and resorts in Vietnam. It is the human capital that will create the differentiation strategy to lure visitors back to Vietnam. Pegasus College stands ready, willing and able to support Vietnam's Human Capital needs.



■ Pegasus International College's Initiatives in Sustainability Research

From 31 May to 2 June, 2017, Dr. Trinh Thi Thu, PIC's Principal, and Dr Abbul Rashid, PIC's CEO, presented their co-authored paper on the importance of education and training to Vietnam's tourism development in 15th APacCHRIE (Council on Hotel, Restaurant, and Institutional Education) conference in Bali, with the participation from many international experts, institutions, and Bali's authorities.

Moreover, Dr. Thu continues to be the Vietnam Country Representative of this council in the period 2016 – 2018. Another co-researched paper with DIESD (Danang Research Institute of Economic- Social Development) on "Biodiversity in the buffer zone of the nature reserve, combining with the cultural preservation of the Co Tu ethnic people towards developing community ecotourism at Hoa Bac Commune, Danang city" was also presented during this occasion.



In addition, PIC has achieved the scholarship (2,700 USD), awarded to Dr. Thu, to present a research on the Agriculture and Food in Bulgaria in 2017-2018, funded by NAFOSTEC (National Foundation for Science and Technology Development of Vietnam). Regarding heritage preservation, PIC has collaborated with Autodesk to conduct research on utilizing 3D technology, namely Autodesk REMAKE software, to digitalize cultural artifacts at the Cham Museum, Danang, which is considered as a great gesture by Board of Directors of the Museum.

C. OUTWARD BOUND VIETNAM

■ International Collaboration

On January 2017, OBV had a business trip to Singapore to visit our Singaporean partners and high/challenge ropes-course developers.

Outward Bound Vietnam (OBV) met with Outward Bound Singapore (OBS) Executive Director Mr. Nicholas Conceicao and his Assistant Director Ms. Ong Chiew Ling. The meeting strengthened the connection of the two schools and set the ball moving forward for future collaboration opportunities. The meeting established that OBS will work with OBV and look to support OBV to promote jointly-delivered OBV-OBS programs to Singaporeans, in Vietnam.

OBV met with Republic Polytechnic (RP) to discuss the opportunity for RP Diploma of Outdoor and Adventure Learning students, to

come to OBV as part of an internship program. Possible learning pathways for OBV instructors were also discussed. RP, in conjunction with OBS and OBV are also interested in the possibility of a three-party collaboration to develop the common ASEAN skill framework standards for Outdoor Education providers and Outward Bound ASEAN.

In the meeting with Hwa Chong Institution (HCI), OBV and HCI are exploring the opportunities for HCI to send their students to Vietnam for jointly conducted OBV-OBS programs, with the emphasis on cultural immersion. The aim would be for SIS students to also attend programs together with the HCI students, to facilitate understanding between the students of differing backgrounds and cultures.

During the trip, OBV also visited a number of Outdoor Activity developers, to research and discuss with them about the construction of our rock-climbing, high/challenge ropes and low-ropes elements, to be constructed at our OBV base-of-operations in Quy Nhon.

In April 2017, OBV joined the OB ASEAN event in Singapore, meeting with the Directors of Outward Bound International (OBI), and the Directors and leaders of OB schools in the ASEAN region, to discuss training and program collaboration opportunities for the region. Additionally, OBV Executive Director, Mr. Wayne Pitts, attended the OBI Program Review Training Event. This training was open to select, experienced and highly qualified Outward Bound staff, with the purpose to train them to become OBI School and Program Auditors.

■ OBV Governing Council

In April 2017, OBV inaugurated its Committee meeting by a joint-meeting of its Advisory Committee and Risk & Safety Management Committee. Members of these Committees are reputable educators and experts in their specialist areas. For this occasion, KinderWorld Education Group invited all overseas members of both Committees to Vietnam. The face-to-face joint meeting was held in Pegasus International UniCenter, in Hanoi. The members then visited the OBV proposed land site in beautiful Ha Long city. Both Committees will have regular meetings to review all aspects of OBV to ensure its sustainable and successful development.

■ Operations

The first half of 2017 has been busy with finalizing our operational circuit in Quy Nhon. Through working with the local people in Cat Hai Province, Binh Dinh, we have discovered some new trekking routes, activity sites, cultural immersion opportunities and community service locations.

Construction on the Multi-Purpose Hall has commenced as of mid-June, which will provide shelter during wet and adverse weather and a space for some of our height activities (rock-climbing, high/challenge ropes activities). At this stage, renovations on the old school, to convert the remaining structures into the new OBV Operational Base, are likely to begin in quarter 4 of this year.

■ Staff

In addition to future collaboration opportunities between OBV and OBS, OBS has continued to support OBV in the training of staff, with our stand-out Assistant Instructor, Thao, completing seven weeks of specialist training, as part of OBS's instructor training program, in May and June.

On the 26th of May, OBV held a 3-day Trainee-Selection-Program for the selected candidates. Those who with good physical capability, and especially a character suitable for OBV were selected and offered an OBV traineeship. Another selection round for OBV trainees will be held in July and August. Training is due to commence in September, and will continue for a period of 6 months, where they will learn all the skills and gain the necessary experience, to become OBV Assistant Instructors.



To conduct the training, we are welcoming our new Training Manager, Gergely Lovász, in July, from Slovakia. Gergely has been working in Outward Bound for over 8 years. In July, we also welcome our new Program Coordinator, Mariya Georgieva, from Romania with 6 years of outdoor and Outward Bound experience. Both of them have their most recent position in OB Hong Kong.

In regards to multi-day programs for SIS students, we will be looking to offer these in terms 3 and 4 of the 2017-2018 school year. Parents and students have expressed a lot of interest in these engaging and potentially life-changing programs and are very keen to participate, so we're looking forward to finally being able to offer them then.

D. PROJECT UPDATES

■ Getting Land Use Right Certificate for Pegasus International College in Phu Quoc.

Phu Quoc island has been thriving, turning itself into a tourism and investment hub in southern Vietnam. Thanks to attractive incentives of the Economic Zone, more and more large-scale projects have been invested in Phu Quoc in recent years. Recognizing potentials of Phu Quoc island, Pegasus International College will be established on an area of 2ha in Duong Dong town with the aim of providing training courses in tourism and hospitality.

December 2016 witnessed a major milestone of the project in which Land lease decision was issued. KinderWorld is obtaining Land Use Right Certificate for the project in order to fulfill legal procedures to start construction of phase I by 2018.



Project Masterplan

■ Developing Masterplan 1/500 for the Project of Pegasus Mixed Education & Eco-tourism Development in Ha Long, Quang Ninh:

Following the success of Singapore Mixed Education Development in Ha Long, KinderWorld is studying and developing Pegasus Mixed Eco-tourism Development in Ha Long on an area of 89.6 ha in Dai Yen ward, Ha Long city. The Project will develop Outward Bound Vietnam and Eco-resorts.

Quang Ninh Provincial People's Committee issued in-principle approval for studying project in July 2016 and approved Planning task in October 2016. KinderWorld is collaborating with Di+ Architecture

Company – a prestigious design consultant of Singapore – to develop the master plan 1/500 for the Project which was reported to Quang Ninh People's Committee in the meeting on 27 June 2017. After getting master plan 1/500 approval, KinderWorld will continue to apply for Investment Certificate and Land Use Right Certificate in the second half of 2017.

- **Obtaining Land Use Right Certificate in May 2017 for Singapore International School in Can Tho City and Prepare to Commence Construction in QIV, 2017**



Project Masterplan

To meet the growing demand for international education services in Mekong Delta region, KinderWorld decided to develop a Singapore International School in Can Tho City on a 25,595 m2 land located in Nguyen Van Cu Street, Ninh Kieu district.

On May 29, 2017, KinderWorld proudly received the Land Use Right Certificate for the project from Can Tho People's Committee. At this moment, KinderWorld is preparing to commence construction in QIV, 2017 and open school by August 2018.

- **Next Phase Construction of Projects of Singapore International School in Gamuda Gardens, Hanoi; Singapore Mixed Education Development in Ha Long, Quang Ninh; and Pegasus Mixed Education & Eco-tourism Development in Binh Dinh.**

In order to welcome new students in 2018, KinderWorld is planning to commence construction for the next phase of three projects in the second half of 2017, including the Singapore International School in Gamuda Gardens, Hanoi; Singapore Mixed Education Development in Ha Long, Quang Ninh; and Pegasus Mixed Education & Eco-tourism Development in Binh Dinh.

Singapore International School in Gamuda Gardens, Hoang Mai district, Hanoi is the first super school of the Group in Hanoi which

is located on an area of 2.3 ha with comprehensive and modern facilities, including: 4 school blocks, football pitch, swimming pool, playground, experimental garden and other supporting facilities. Phase 1 of the Project has been put into operation since 2015 and

welcomed about 600 students. Phase 2 of the Project will start construction in QIII, 2017 and commence operation in QIV, 2018. Phase 2 construction includes: Block 2 (capacity of 655 students), roofed swimming pools, and other supporting facilities and infrastructure.

Phase II of Singapore Mixed Education Development Project in Ha Long, Quang Ninh will also be kicked off in QIV, 2017, including a school block and a football pitch, to prepare for school opening in August 2018.

As for Pegasus Mixed Education & Eco-tourism Development Project in Binh Dinh, Phase I of Outward Bound Vietnam area has been implemented and will be completed in October 2017, including: Multi – purpose hall; In door house and canteen; Electricity station; Store and Guard House; Kayak store.
